Board Meeting Minutes for February 15, 2012

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by President Curt Barrett.

1. **Guest comments** - Guest/homeowner Tracy Krauss discussed starting a Neighborhood Watch in Tanterra. The requirements were discussed regarding minimum participation required for training. An item will be placed in the newsletter and online as well as with the Yahoo group to gauge interest.
2. **Minutes** - A motion was made by Wayne Johnson to approve the minutes of the January 19, 2012 Board minutes as submitted and previously distributed to Board members. Glen McEwen seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
3. **Treasurer's Report** - Clerk Elizabeth Bialas distributed the current Balance Sheet and Profit & Loss Statement (as of January 31, 2012). Charlie Cook reviewed the current finances with the Board and there are no problems. The special assessment billing statements will be mailed the week of February 16. A CD has matured and must be reinvested. A discussion was held regarding the adequacy of the reserve fund. Lee Erlichman will look further into options.

4. Committee Reports:

Pool Committee:

Wayne Johnson reported that the pool building committee reviewed final bids from the three contractors who were interested in the work. All contractors had very good referrals. Direct comparisons were made between the three proposals and there was a \$60,000.00 range between high and low bids. The committee met with the owner of Catania Construction who was the low bidder and were impressed with his presentation and further references which were provided. A final contract review was to be conducted February 17. The pool building committee recommended that Catania construction be used as contractor for the pool rebuild. A motion was made by Glenn Wasik to award the contract to Catania Construction as long as it is not more than \$400,000.00. Charlie Cook seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The Board offered praise to the pool reconstruction committee for the work they have performed dealing with the very extended bidding process, with particular thanks to Wayne Johnson as Chair.

Architectural Committee:

Grounds Committee:

Ron White reported that branches and logs need to be picked up in the common areas. A sign will be put up in the tennis courts reminding homeowners to pick up after their dogs. The bike paths and the pool parking lot need work. A notice will be put in Tanterra Today regarding a work party for April 21. This will be for general grounds clean up. Interested volunteers should meet in the pool parking lot at 10:30 am.

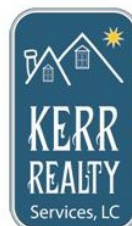

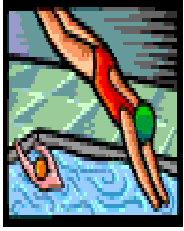

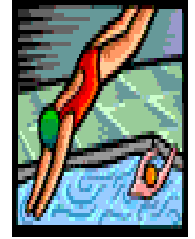

Tanterra Swim & Dive Team: Is it Right for My Child?



Many families are unsure if their child should be a part of the team. The swim team is made up of athletes who are just starting to learn to swim competitively to those who swim on teams year round. There is a place for every level of swimmer on the team. Kevin Vallario, Tanterra's new head coach, is very confident in his ability to teach each child fundamental and advanced techniques for each stroke in a fun and positive manner. In addition to swimming, there are many social activities for the children (and parents!) to enjoy throughout the summer. One of the best benefits (aspects) of joining the Tanterra Swim and Dive team is the close community feeling everyone experiences.

Pre Team

Our pre-team is for our youngest swimmers from age 5 through 8. The goal of this program is two-fold: (1) to encourage a love of swimming at an early age, and (2) to prepare swimmers for participation in age group swimming once they have acquired the necessary skills. If your child is older than eight, they can still join the fun. All age groups are broken down by level, so each child is placed with other children at his/her level. Dive On In

Is your child ready for a new challenge? Does your child love going off the diving board? Then the dive team is the place for them! Tanterra is one of 25 pools in Montgomery County that has a dive team. The 8 & under age group allows our youngest divers to participate with a front jump, back jump and head first standing dive into the pool and receive accolades from the spectators and participation ribbons for every meet. Your child only needs to be able to get from the diving board to the ladder unassisted and with confidence. The dive coach will teach them the rest. We encourage children of all ages to join, beginning at 5 years of age.

Tanterra Swim & Dive Team Online Registration Opens April 14

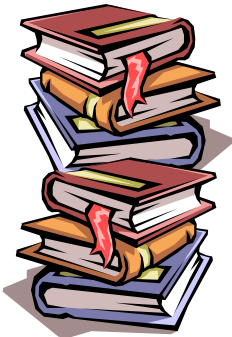

THE APRIL LANDSCAPE GARDENER

Warm to hot weather in mid- to late March has had quite an effect on the natural progression of Springtime events. "Normal" timetables for activities have to be adjusted to compensate for the rapid and compressed natural occurrences. Tree flowering, which is usually spread out over one to two months, occurred within a two week frenzy. What will the weather pattern be for the next weeks? It will have an impact on the tender foliage, and the insect populations which will be attacking our plants. To what degree remains unclear at this point.

MAINTENANCE FOR APRIL - Normal vs. Newly Revised Due to Warm Weather

NORMAL: Begin mowing. Bluegrass and turf type tall fescues prefer being cut at 2 ½" to 3" for the spring months and switching to 3-3 ½" as the hot weather comes in June to shade the turf. Mow at least once a week and leave the clippings on the lawn to decompose and return nutrients to the soil.

NEW: Mowing needed to start somewhere around the 20th – 25th of March.

NORMAL: Pre-emergent lawn application should have been done by now. If not, do ASAP. If you seeded this spring you will have to use a product containing Tupersan, chemical name Siduron (I have been hearing advertising for a new Scotts product that can be used with new seedings; you may want to try it), followed by the regular pre-emergent in six weeks after the newly seeded grass has grown enough to tolerate it.

NEW: Pre-emergents were put down early. If you have waited until you read this you will have missed some of the early germinating weed seeds. You can still put down a pre-emergent, which will take care of un-germinated weed seeds for the rest of the season, but will need to also put down a post emergent that will kill already germinated young crabgrass seedlings as well.

NORMAL: Broadleaf weeds can most effectively be controlled late April through June. You need a large leaf area to hit (early sprays may miss some of the weeds that emerge late, such as the clovers and sedges) and the temperatures must not exceed 80-85 degrees before the spray dries. Broadleaf sprays should not be used close to desirable ornamental plants where overspray may do damage. Under trees should be done on an "as needed" basis only, as the material can be taken up by tree roots and do damage.

NEW: this application may be moved to an earlier time frame, if desired.

Edge and mulch planting beds. Mulch to a depth of 1-2", no more. If old mulch is crusty, rake to break it up prior to applying the new layer. Too much mulch can exclude oxygen and water from the roots of desirable plants and encourage root growth into the mulch where the roots will die from the next winters' cold. Application of a pre-emergent weed control to the planting beds can reduce hand weeding later in the summer months, sometimes considerably. The warmer winter weather allowed the mulch eating bacteria to remain active. This bacteria decomposed the mulch at a faster rate. Re-Mulching will probably be needed by most of us as a result.

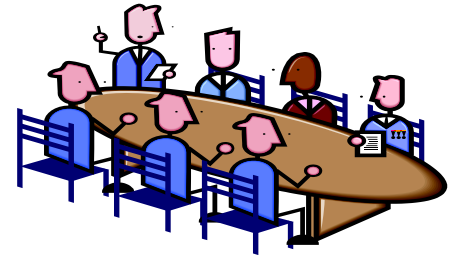
Renewal prune plants, such as forsythia, which have already finished blooming. Forsythia can be controlled and kept manageable if cut to the ground every 2-3 years immediately after flowering.

Start monitoring for insect pests. If spotted, try to control with oils and biological agents. When targeted at young insect populations these controls are very effective and less hazardous to you and the environment. For a few aphids on your rose buds, using your fingers to crush them is an effective mechanical control that allows the predators time to catch up to the explosion of the aphid population. Once caught up, the predators can keep the pest population in check, often for the remainder of the summer. Careful monitoring, looking on the undersides of leaves, looking for exit holes in bark and into the interior of plants can detect insect population increases in time to use control measures to keep major plant damage to a minimum.
